Real Disasters Happen to Real Hams: The **Great Tubbs Fire of 2017**

At 11:02 PM, October 8, 2017, I answered my land line and heard:

"THIS IS SONOMA COUNTY SHERIFF **EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION -**EVACUATE IMMEDIATELY - THIS IS AN EVACUATION CALL - THIS IS NOT A DRILL -EVACUATE IMMEDIATELY - THERE IS A WILDFIRE AND MARK WEST SPRINGS ROAD MUST EVACUATE"

I walked to the top of the driveway and watched the full moon go from crimson red to completely blacked out - not good. At 11:02 PM, I received the emergency evacuation call on my landline and raced to the closest neighbors and woke them up. I phoned the more distant neighbors, rousing them - FIRE, GET OUT NOW,

went back into the house for food. But, I heard in my head "NO!" so I immediately moved towards the front door. I asked, "what do I need before I leave?" and heard the answer in my head "YOU NEED TO GET OUT NOW! LEAVE NOW!" I grabbed my flashlight and sleeping bag, locked the front door, got into my car, and drove away.

The NCVEC Question Pool Committee has announced some errors in the 2018-2022 FCC Element 2 (Technician class) Question Pool released on January 8. These changes have been made in the download files as

of January 12: **T1F11** -- Distractor A; change "They" to "The"; **T4A01** -- Change to correct answer; correct answer is D; **T5B13** -- Distractor A; change "GHZ" to "GHz"; **T6A07** -- Modified question. "What electrical component is usually constructed as a coil of wire?" **T8C08** -- Distractor A; change "VOIP" to "VoIP". ARRL VEC teams are advised to check the NCVEC website regularly for updates to the Question Pool, which may include errata and withdrawn questions. The new Element 2 Question Pool goes into effect on July 1, 2018.

The new Saltgrass repeater needs some tuning of the duplexers to improve sensitivity. Thanks to Steve, N5ZUA for keeping this complex system up and running.

Progress on the Alto Intertie repeater is going steady in the right direction with only a couple of setbacks, the PL encoder in the repeater failed and one of the small cooling fans shorted out and had to be replaced but luckily, I had replacements for both! The replacement controller (CatAuto Cat-300dxl) is interfaced and working well with the Micor repeater and I am now interfacing the two UHF link transceivers and the UHF control receiver to the multiport link board. More next month!

6. ARRL NEWS:



Amendment to ARRL DXCC Rules Expands DXCC List

The ARRL Board of Directors approved a motion to amend the DXCC Rules, when it met January 19-20. Section II, Subsection 1 of the DXCC Rules now will include a new Subsection (d): The entity has a separate <u>IARU member society</u> and is included on the US State Department <u>Independent States in the World</u>.

"The discussion during the Board meeting



and the rule change did not address any specific entity," ARRL Radiosport Manager Norm Fusaro, W3IZ, said. "The amendment could allow some additions to the current DXCC List of entities. It's a good thing not only for DXCC, but for all active hams."

Effective on January 21 at 0000 UTC, the Republic of Kosovo (Z6) was added to the DXCC List of current entities, increasing the total number of current DXCC entities to 340. Nothing is retroactive, Fusaro said. A new Logbook of The World (LoTW) *TQSL* configuration file (v.11.4) has been released to accommodate the addition. --ARRL Letter Jan 25, 2018

Club Group Will Operate W1AW for Winter Field Day:

Maxim Memorial Station W1AW will host a group that will take part in Winter Field Day later this month. Sponsored by the Winter Field Day Association (WFDA), Winter Field Day will take place over the January 27-28 weekend, and it can be an opportune time to



prep for ARRL Field Day in June.

"Assuming the weather holds out, a group of hams will be here the last

weekend of January to operate W1AW in the Winter Field Day," W1AW Station Manager Joe Carcia, NJ1Q, said this week. Headed by Frank Gitto, KA5VVI, the group will consist of members of the Warren County Amateur Radio Club (W2WCR) in New York. Gitto said the club is hoping to have a dozen members at W1AW, operating in shifts of six. Carcia said the Warren County ARC operators will avoid the harsh elements and operate from indoors at W1AW, in the "home" station category.

For the hardier within the Amateur Radio ranks, Winter Field Day is an excuse to get out of the house and enjoy the great outdoors, and -- let's face it -- it's not cold and snowy everywhere during the winter. Gitto said that some Warren County ARC members will be operating WFD from Indian Lake, New York, using special event call sign W2C.

The event, which got its start in 2007, is not restricted to North America. There are three entry categories -- indoor, outdoor, and home. The <u>rules</u> are similar to those for ARRL Field Day. See here for details--

Ham Organizations



The Radio Amateur Satellite Corporation, or AMSAT, is a worldwide group of Amateur Radio Operators (Hams). It was formed in the District of Columbia in 1969 as an educational organization.

AMSAT's goal is to foster Amateur Radio's participation in space research and communication. The Organization was founded to continue the efforts, begun in 1961, by Project OSCAR, a west coast USA-based group which built and launched the very first Amateur Radio satellite, OSCAR, on December 12, 1961, barely four years after the launch of Russia's first Sputnik.
